*Dr. Ebbe Munck, 69, Dead; Danish
Resistance Leader*

COPENHAGEN, Denmark, May 2 (AP)—Dr. Ebbe Munck, veteran Arctic explorer, journalist and diplomat who became Nazi-occupied Denmark's chief spokesman in the free world during World War II, died today after a brief illness. He was 69 years old.

Dr. Munck's long career took him to the Spanish Civil War and the Finish winter war as a newspaper correspondent, to Greenland as organizer or member of numerous expeditions, to Southeast Asia as ambassador in Bangkok, Thailand, and Rangoon, Burma, and to Canada and the Far East traveling with the then Crown Princess Margrethe, now Queen Margrethe II, as her personally picked court chamberlain.

But his greatest achievements came during World War II when he became the Stockholm-based representative of the Danish Freedom Council and the main link between occupied Denmark and the rest of the world. He risked his life on secret missions to Denmark and engineered the escape of Neils Bohr, atomic physicist and Nobel Prize-winner, one of the fathers of the atom bomb.
